


# God Washes Away our Sins




# Saint Oswald

## February 28




WHEN HE WENT BACK TO ENGLAND HE WAS MADE A BISHOP.

WHEN AN ENEMY KING DESTROYED A MONASTERY, OSWALD WENT TO SAVE THE RELICS FROM THE RUINS.




